GUEST ARTISTS AND ORCHESTRA HOSPITALITY

Provide local transportation to schools, rehearsals etc., as requested by the Symphony Office. Be a guide for the day. Show off Cheyenne.

TRANSPORTATION TO AND FROM DIA

Drive to DIA to pick up or drop off guest artists and conductor, as requested by the Symphony Office.

REFRESHMENTS

Provide food for rehearsals (This year the Friends of the Symphony is providing freshly baked cookies. All members of the Friends are encouraged to help in this endeavor.)

RECEPTIONS

Help with special receptions. This may include setting up, decorating, serving and clean-up.

ARTS AMBASSADORS

Greet patrons at concerts, Classic Conversation, receptions and community events.

Assist passing out programs or other materials, as required.

Assist at the Friends table, located in the lobby.

Distribute brochures and sell CDs.

Promote and encourage membership in the Friends of the Symphony.

Spread the word about the CSO, and encourage season ticket subscriptions.

Cookies

For many years, the <u>Friends of the Symphony</u> group has provided cookies for the orchestra rehearsal breaks. This is a show of appreciation to the members for the hours that they spend traveling, rehearsing, and presenting wonderful concerts.

Members of the Friends provide cookies and bars at each of the four rehearsals. This is usually on Sunday, Tuesday, Thursday evenings, and Saturday afternoon. The cookies are delivered to the Green Room by 6:00 P.M. for evening rehearsals, and 2:00 P.M. for the Saturday afternoon rehearsal. They may be delivered to the CSO office earlier in the day (not Saturday).

Access to the Green Room is through the west door (Stage Door) of the Civic Center.

The best cookies are, of course, fresh baked. However, cookies from <u>Eileen's</u> and grocery store bakeries are also good. Please try to avoid packaged cookies from the store shelves. To transport cookies to the Civic Center, it's best to simply put them in gallon *Ziplock* bags. Putting them on cardboard "flats" work well. The "host" will put cookies and bars on trays before placing them out for the orchestra members' breaks.

Most concerts require approximately 36 to 48 dozen cookies for the week. Therefore we need LOTS of help to cover a whole season! Thanks to all who volunteered.
